She has a strong interest in child health policy, quality improvement and research in these areas.

Presentation Summary:

Infants, children, and adolescents with special health care needs and their families constitute a population with exceptional and often long-term health, educational, developmental and social service needs, which are extensive and expensive to deliver. The purpose of this webinar is to examine programs and practices (the systems) which have evolved to meet the needs of these children and families.
