Dear MCAH colleagues in California:

As requested by FHOP and CDPH-MCAH, I am sending a copy of our Survey that we're sending to community partners. As of March 19th, we have 70 responses from community partners and 31 responses from MCAH staff. We will qualitatively analyze the data and utilize the prioritization process for the Community Partners to discuss specific problems in small groups at either of our community partner convenings. In addition to the two community partner convenings described below, we're planning other meetings with focus on: childhood nutrition & physical activity; childhood environments; child abuse; inequities in african-american birth outcomes.

Asking the open-ended questions required by CDPH-MCAH has worked out well. We're receiving lots of good information and the questions coincide with the Results-Based Accountability approach that our Health Officer is leading for SFDPH.

A small aside, we're systematically reviewing surveys, focus groups, and community needs assessments from other SF agencies to better understand the needs of our low-income population. There is a small proportion of our community partners who are actually low-income mothers and youth, but their ongoing participation with our collaborative groups suggest that their views don't necessarily represent the socially isolated members of our county (e.g., those willing to attend public health meetings are more likely to initiate prenatal care in first trimester).

If you were to use this survey template, I would suggest that we all try to ask questions exactly the same way (if possible). In this way, we could combine and compare data between counties.

We are very interested in learning how other counties are conducting their Needs Assessment and Action Plan meetings. Please do ask questions, share your ideas, and teach us how to do better!
